BY THE BLESSINGS OF ALMIGHTY GOD

THE REGENT OF GRESIK,

Considering: a. that as a manifestation of the Governments responsibility towards the community, especially the elderly and persons with disabilities, and to protect against the possibility of social risks, the Gresik Regency Government needs to provide assistance;

b. that the Inclusive Family Hope Program for the Elderly and Persons with Disabilities of Gresik Regency is one of the key outputs of Nawakarsa or 9 (nine) navigation changes as a development strategy of the New Gresik Regency to support the realization of the vision and mission of the Regent and Deputy Regent as stated in the Gresik Regency Regional Medium-Term Development Plan 2021-2026 which aims to improve the welfare of the people of Gresik Regency;

c. that based on the provisions in Section 28 paragraph (1) of Government Regulation Number 39 of 2012

concerning the Implementation of Social Welfare and the Appendix to the Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs Number 77 of 2020 concerning Technical Guidelines for Regional Financial Management, social assistance expenditure is used to budget the provision of assistance in the form of money and/or goods to individuals, families, groups and/or communities that are not continuous and selective in nature, which aims to protect against the possibility of social risks, except in certain circumstances it can be sustainable;

d. that based on the considerations referred to in subparagraphs a, b, and c, it is necessary to issue a Regional Regulation on the Inclusive Family Hope Program for the Elderly and Persons with Disabilities in Gresik Regency;

Decides:

To enact: A REGENTS REGULATION ON THE INCLUSIVE FAMILY HOPE PROGRAM FOR THE ELDERLY AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES IN THE REGENCY OF GRESIK.

## CHAPTER I

### GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### Article 1

In this Regents Regulation:

1. Region means Gresik Regency.

2. Regency Government means the Gresik Regency Government.

3. Regent means the Regent of Gresik.

4. Social Service means the Gresik Regency Social Service.

5. Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget, hereinafter abbreviated as APBD, means the Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget of Gresik Regency.

6. Social Welfare means the condition of fulfillment of the material, spiritual, and social needs of citizens so that they can live decently and develop themselves, so that they can carry out their social functions.

7. Social Empowerment means all efforts directed at preventing and handling risks from social shocks and vulnerabilities.

8. Social Security means an institutionalized scheme to guarantee all people to be able to meet their basic decent living needs.

9. Social Assistance means the provision of assistance in the form of money and/or goods to individuals, families, groups and/or communities that are not continuous and selective in nature, which aims to protect against the possibility of social risks.

10. Minimum Basic Needs are needs that must be met by humans in order to live decently, including food, drink, housing, clothing, education, and health.

11. Integrated Social Welfare Data, hereinafter abbreviated as DTKS, means the master data containing data on those in need of social welfare services, recipients of social assistance and empowerment, as well as the potential and sources of social welfare.

12. Management of Integrated Social Welfare Data,

hereinafter referred to as Data Management, means systematic activities in the arrangement, storage, and maintenance of data, which includes the data proposal process, verification and validation, determination, and use of data needed to ensure data accessibility, reliability, timeliness, and accountability in its use for the implementation of Social Welfare.

13. Elderly, hereinafter abbreviated as Elderly, means a person who has reached the age of 60 (sixty) years and above.

14. Person with Disabilities means any person who experiences long-term physical, intellectual, mental, and/or sensory limitations that, when interacting with the environment, may experience obstacles and difficulties in participating fully and effectively with other citizens based on equal rights.

15. Assistive Device means an object that functions to help the independence of Persons with Disabilities in carrying out daily activities.

16. Inclusive means an effort to improve the standard of living of the elderly and people with disabilities to achieve a better and more prosperous quality of life.

17. Family Hope Program, hereinafter abbreviated as PKH, means a program providing conditional Social Assistance to poor and vulnerable families and/or individuals who are registered in the integrated data of the poor handling program, processed by the social welfare data and information center and designated as PKH beneficiaries.

18. Inclusive Family Hope Program, hereinafter abbreviated



as Inclusive PKH, means a program providing conditional social assistance to the Elderly and Persons with Disabilities.

19. Bank Managing the General Cash Account of Gresik Regency, hereinafter abbreviated as Bank RKUD, means PT Bank Pembangunan Daerah Jawa Timur Tbk.

20. Accompaniment means the implementation of activities by a person who is given tasks, functions, and authority by the Social Service for a certain period of time in providing Inclusive PKH Social Assistance in the Region.

21. Village means a Village in Gresik Regency.

22. Kelurahan means Kelurahan in Gresik Regency.

## CHAPTER II

### INTENT, OBJECTIVES, AND TYPES OF PROGRAMS

#### Article 2

The intent of this Regents Regulation is as a guideline in the implementation of Inclusive PKH for the Elderly and Persons with Disabilities in the Region.

#### Article 3

Inclusive PKH as referred to in Article 2 aims to:

a. improve the standard of living and welfare of beneficiaries through the utilization of Social Assistance in the form of money channeled in cash and/or

non-cash;

b. reduce expenditure burden and increase beneficiary income;

c. create better behavioral changes and beneficiary independence in accessing Social Welfare; and

d. reduce poverty and inequality.

#### Article 4

Inclusive PKH as referred to in Article 2 consists of:

a. Social Assistance; and

b. Accompaniment.

### CHAPTER III

#### BENEFICIARIES

#### Article 5

(1) Beneficiaries of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance as referred to in Article 4 are intended for the Elderly and Persons with Disabilities with the following criteria:

a. registered in the DTKS;

b. Elderly and/or Persons with Disabilities who have not received Social Assistance; and

c. residents of the Region who have an Identity Card (KTP), Population Identification Number (NIK), and Family Card (KK) in accordance with applicable regulations.

(2) Beneficiaries of Persons with Disabilities as referred to

in section (1) consist of:

- a. Persons with physical disabilities;
- b. Persons with intellectual disabilities;
- c. Persons with mental disabilities; and/or
- d. Persons with sensory disabilities.

(3) Beneficiaries as referred to in section (1) are not State Civil Apparatus/Members of the Indonesian National Army/Members of the Indonesian National Police/ Employees of State-Owned Enterprises/Employees of Regional-Owned Enterprises, Government Employees with Work Agreements, or recipients of certification for educators.

(4) In the event that the beneficiary of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance is the Elderly as referred to in section (1) subparagraph b, who are husband and wife, only one of them will receive the assistance.

(5) The beneficiaries of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance as referred to in section (1) are a maximum of 2 (two) persons in 1 (one) Family Card (KK).

(6) The criteria for the Elderly who have not received Social Assistance as referred to in section (1) subparagraph b are the Elderly who have not received Non-Cash Food Assistance (BPNT), Cash Social Assistance (BST), PKH, and the East Java Provincial Social Security program.

(7) The number of beneficiaries for each fiscal year as referred to in section (1) is determined based on the regional financial capacity.

## CHAPTER IV

## SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

### Article 6

(1) Social Assistance as referred to in Article 4 subparagraph a is provided in the form of money disbursed non-cash.

(2) The amount of Social Assistance as referred to in section (1) is given 4 (four) times in 1 (one) year with an amount of Rp500,000.00 (five hundred thousand rupiah) per stage.

(3) The name of the recipient, the address of the recipient, and the amount of Social Assistance as referred to in section (1) are determined by the Regents Decision.

## CHAPTER V

## ACCOMPANIMENT

### Article 7

The Elderly and Persons with Disabilities also receive Inclusive PKH Social Assistance in the form of Accompaniment as referred to in Article 4 subparagraph b, in the form of:

- a. facilitation for the utilization of health and social welfare services;
- b. education, family capacity building meetings;
- c. business assistance; and
- d. advocacy for receiving other social assistance.

## Article 8

(1) The Accompaniment as referred to in Article 7 is carried out by:

- a. expert team;
- b. coordinator;
- c. social volunteers; and
- d. relevant regional apparatus.

(2) The implementers of the accompaniment as referred to in section (1) are determined by the Regents Decision.

## CHAPTER V

### DISBURSEMENT MECHANISM

## Article 9

(1) The disbursement mechanism for Inclusive PKH Social Assistance is carried out through several stages as follows:

- a. activity planning;
- b. verification of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance recipient data by the Village Head based on nominative DTKS data from the Social Service;
- c. determination of potential participants in Inclusive PKH Social Assistance by the Village Head;
- d. validation of potential beneficiaries of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance by the Social Service;
- e. determination of beneficiaries of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance by the Regent;

- f. disbursement of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance through Bank RKUD;
- g. accompaniment of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance beneficiaries;
- h. family capacity building meetings (P2K2) of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance beneficiaries;
- i. verification of the commitment of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance beneficiaries;
- j. updating of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance beneficiary data;
- k. termination of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance; and
- l. replacement of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance beneficiaries.

(2) The technical mechanism for the disbursement of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance as referred to in section (1) is regulated in the Technical Guidelines for the Implementation of Inclusive PKH Social Assistance, which is determined by the Decision of the Head of the Social Service.

## CHAPTER VI

### MONITORING, EVALUATION, AND SUPERVISION

#### Article 10

(1) Monitoring of the implementation of Inclusive PKH as referred to in Article 4 is carried out at each stage of the activity or as needed.

(2) Monitoring as referred to in section (1) is carried out by

the Inclusive PKH Technical Implementation Team.

(3) The Technical Implementation Team as referred to in section (2) is determined by the Regents Decision.

## Article 11

The Inclusive PKH Technical Implementation Team as referred to in Article 10 section (3) is responsible for:

- a. implementing all policies for the implementation of Inclusive PKH, including target setting, validation, verification, termination, assistance disbursement, partnership, and human resource management;
- b. ensuring that the implementation of Inclusive PKH is in accordance with the plan;
- c. resolving problems in the implementation of Inclusive PKH;
- d. building networks and partnerships with various parties for the expansion and improvement of Inclusive PKH;
- e. conducting monitoring and control of Inclusive PKH activities; and
- f. compiling and submitting reports on the implementation of Inclusive PKH to the Head of the Social Service.

## Article 12

(1) Evaluation of the implementation of Inclusive PKH as referred to in Article 4 is carried out at the end of the fiscal year or as needed.

(2) The evaluation as referred to in section (1) is carried out by the Inclusive PKH Steering Committee.

(3) The Steering Committee as referred to in section (2) is determined by the Regents Decision.

## Article 13

The Inclusive PKH Steering Committee as referred to in Article 12 section (3) is responsible for:

- a. conducting cross-sectoral coordination;
- b. reviewing various operational plans for the implementation of Inclusive PKH;
- c. conducting a review of implementation, mechanisms, audit results, and evaluation;
- d. conducting supervision and control of the implementation of Inclusive PKH; and
- e. providing reports to the Regent.

## Article 14

Supervision of the implementation of Inclusive PKH as referred to in Article 13 subparagraph d can be carried out by the community in accordance with the provisions of applicable regulations.

## CHAPTER VII

### REPORTING

## Article 15

(1) Bank RKUD submits reports on the implementation of



Inclusive PKH to the Head of the Social Service.

(2) The Head of the Social Service submits reports on the implementation of Inclusive PKH as referred to in section (1) to the Regent.

(3) The reports as referred to in section (1) and section (2) include:

- a. implementation report; and
- b. accountability report.

(4) The form and procedure for reporting as referred to in section (3) are determined by the Decision of the Head of the Social Service.

## Article 16

(1) Complaints regarding the implementation of Inclusive PKH are formed as a manifestation of the programs openness and accountability to the public.

(2) Complaints regarding the implementation of Inclusive PKH as referred to in section (1) can be made by individuals, groups, institutions, or community organizations.

(3) Complaints regarding the implementation of Inclusive PKH as referred to in section (1) are handled at the village and sub-district levels.

(4) Complaints as referred to in section (1) can be made through:

- a. the official media of the Regional Government;
- b. the Social Service; and
- c. Bank RKUD.

## Article 17

(1) The resolution of complaints as referred to in Article 16 is carried out hierarchically.

(2) The resolution of complaint handling as referred to in section (1) is carried out in accordance with the provisions of applicable regulations.

## CHAPTER VIII

### FUNDING

## Article 18

Funding for Inclusive PKH as referred to in Article 4 is sourced from:

- a. APBD; and
- b. other legitimate and non-binding sources of funds in accordance with applicable regulations.

## CHAPTER IX

### TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

## Article 19

The provision of Social Assistance to beneficiaries as referred to in Article 5 in the 2022 fiscal year is given 4 (four) times, starting in August 2022.

## CHAPTER X

### CLOSING PROVISIONS

#### Article 20

This Regents Regulation shall come into force on the date of its enactment.

In order for everyone to know, it is ordered that this Regents Regulation be enacted by placing it in the Gresik Regency Regional Gazette.
