ACCELERATED INTEGRATED STUNTING REDUCTION

IN THE REGENCY OF GRESIK

The Regent of Gresik,

Considering: a. that in realizing healthy, intelligent, and productive human resources in achieving the goals of sustainable development, it is necessary to accelerate stunting reduction;

b. that to follow up on Presidential Regulation Number 72 of 2021 concerning the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction, holistic, integrative, and quality handling must be carried out through coordination, synergy, and synchronization among the government, universities, professional organizations, community organizations, religious organizations, non-governmental organizations, philanthropic institutions, mass media, business actors, and community members;

c. that based on the considerations referred to in points a and b, it is necessary to issue a Regional Regulation on Accelerated Integrated Stunting Reduction in the Regency of Gresik;

Decides:

To Enact: A REGIONAL REGULATION ON ACCELERATED INTEGRATED STUNTING REDUCTION AND PREVENTION IN THE REGENCY OF GRESIK.

## CHAPTER I

### GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### Article 1

In this Regional Regulation:

1. Region means the Regency of Gresik.
2. Regional Government means the Gresik Regency Government.
3. Regent means the Regent of Gresik.
4. Sub-district Head means the Sub-district Head in the Regency of Gresik.
5. Village Government means the village head or otherwise called, assisted by village officials as elements of village government administration.
6. Regional Apparatus means the supporting elements of the Regional Head and the Regional House of Representatives in the administration of government affairs that are within the authority of the Region.
7. Regional Development Planning, Research, and Development Agency, hereinafter referred to as BAPPEDA, means the BAPPEDA of the Regency of Gresik.
8. Stunting is a disorder of growth and development in children due to chronic malnutrition and recurrent infections, characterized by length or height below the standard set by the minister responsible for government affairs in the field of health.
9. Accelerated Stunting Reduction is any effort that includes specific interventions and sensitive interventions implemented convergently, holistically, integratively, and qualitatively through multi-sectoral cooperation in the region and village.
10. Specific Intervention is an activity carried out to overcome the direct causes of stunting.
11. Sensitive Intervention is an activity carried out to overcome the indirect causes of stunting.
12. Monitoring is the activity of observing the progress of the implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction, identifying, and anticipating problems that have arisen and/or will arise so that action can be taken as early as possible.
13. Reporting is the activity of periodically submitting documents on the progress or results of the

implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction by the implementers of Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

14. Evaluation is a series of activities comparing the target and achievement of the implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

15. Stakeholders are individuals, communities, academics, professional organizations, businesses, mass media, civil society organizations, universities, community leaders, religious leaders, and development partners related to Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

16. Convergence is an intervention approach carried out in a coordinated, integrated, and joint manner towards target groups in priority geographical areas and households (Adolescents, Prospective Couples, Pregnant Women, Breastfeeding Mothers, and Children aged 0-59 months) in locations with priority handling.

17. Adolescent is a person aged 10 (ten) to 24 (twenty-four) years who is not married.

18. Nutritional Surveillance is regular and continuous observation carried out by nutritionists on all aspects of nutritional problems, both the condition and its distribution in a particular community for the purposes of acceleration and prevention.

19. Prevalence is a statistical concept that refers to the number of disease cases present in a particular population at a particular time, while incidence refers to the number of new cases that develop over a period of time.

20. Behavior Change Communication is a systematic and interactive approach model aimed at influencing and changing the specific behavior of a target group.

## CHAPTER II

### INTENT AND PURPOSE

#### Article 2

(1) The intent of enacting this Regional Regulation is:

a. as a basis for the implementation of the convergence of stunting reduction and prevention programs, from planning, implementation, monitoring, evaluation, and reporting;

- b. as a guideline for integrated stunting reduction interventions for the Region and all stakeholders in the Region in supporting the acceleration of stunting reduction; and
- c. to realize a younger generation in the Region who are healthy, intelligent, productive, and of quality, and to have an impact on increasing the Human Development Index.

(2) This Regional Regulation is intended as a guideline for:

- a. integrating and harmonizing programs or activities related to stunting reduction in an integrated manner to be implemented in a targeted and precise manner; and
- b. strengthening commitment from planning, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of the implementation of each field of duty in order to achieve the interim target of stunting reduction in the Region.

## CHAPTER III

### SCOPE

#### Article 3

The scope of this Regional Regulation includes:

- a. strategies, targets, and pillars of accelerated stunting reduction;
- b. the administration of accelerated stunting reduction;
- c. coordination of the administration of accelerated stunting reduction;
- d. monitoring, evaluation, and reporting;
- e. community participation; and
- f. funding.

## CHAPTER IV

### STRATEGY FOR ACCELERATED STUNTING REDUCTION

## Article 4

(1) In the context of Accelerated Stunting Reduction in the Region, a Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction is established.

(2) The Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (1) aims to:

- a. reduce the prevalence of Stunting;
- b. improve the quality of family life preparation;
- c. ensure the fulfillment of nutritional intake;
- d. improve parenting patterns;
- e. increase access to and quality of health services; and
- f. increase access to clean water and sanitation.

## Article 5

The implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction with target groups includes:

- a. adolescents;
- b. prospective couples;
- c. pregnant women;
- d. breastfeeding mothers; and
- e. children aged 0 (zero) ? 59 (fifty-nine) months.

## Article 6

(1) The Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in Article 3 is implemented to achieve the national sustainable development goals target in 2030.

(2) The achievement of the sustainable development goals target as referred to in section (1) is implemented through the achievement of the stunting prevalence target measured in children under 5 (five) years of age.

## Article 7

(1) In order to achieve the Stunting prevalence target as referred to in Article 5 section (1), an interim target of 10% (ten percent) is set to be achieved in 2024.

(2) The interim target of Stunting prevalence as referred to in section (1) is detailed in the targets, target indicators, target and year of achievement, responsible party, and supporting Regional Apparatus.

(3) The Stunting prevalence target for the period 2025-2030 is determined based on the results of the evaluation of the achievement of the interim target in 2024 as referred to in section (1).

## Article 8

(1) The Stunting prevalence target in 2024 is achieved through the implementation of 5 (five) pillars in the Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

(2) The pillars in the Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (1) include:

- a. increased commitment and leadership vision at the Regional and Village government levels;
- b. increased behavior change communication and community empowerment;
- c. increased convergence of Specific Interventions and Sensitive Interventions in the Regional Government and Village Government;
- d. increased food and nutrition security at the individual, family, and community levels; and
- e. strengthening and development of systems, data, information, research, and innovation.

(3) The pillars as referred to in section (1) are detailed in activities, outputs, targets and year of achievement, responsible party, Regional Apparatus, and supporting parties.

## Article 9

(1) The Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction consists of:

- a. interim targets for accelerated stunting reduction; and

b. a description of the pillars of the national strategy for accelerated stunting reduction.

(2) The Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (1) is listed in the Appendix, which is an inseparable part of this Regional Regulation.

## Article 10

(1) In the implementation of the Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in Article 8, a Regional action plan is prepared using an approach focused on families at risk of Stunting.

(2) The Regional action plan as referred to in section (1) consists of priority activities that at least include:

- a. provision of data on families at risk of Stunting;
- b. mentoring of families at risk of Stunting;
- c. mentoring of all prospective couples or prospective fertile couples;
- d. surveillance of families at risk of Stunting;
- e. Stunting case audit;
- f. Stunting deliberation;
- g. mini Stunting workshop; and
- h. coordination meeting on Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

(3) The Regional action plan as referred to in section (1) is implemented by the Regional Government, Village Government, and Stakeholders.

(4) The Regional action plan as referred to in section (1) is established by the Regent.

## Article 11

(1) The provision of data on families at risk of Stunting as referred to in Article 10 section (2) point a aims to provide operational data through:

- a. screening of reproductive health for prospective couples/prospective fertile couples 3 (three) months before marriage;
- b. screening of pregnant women;
- c. screening of families for food availability, eating patterns, and nutritional intake;

- d. screening of families with fertile couples after childbirth and after miscarriage;
- e. screening of families for the care of children under five years of age; and
- f. screening of families for ownership of healthy home facilities.

(2) Mentoring of families at risk of stunting as referred to in Article 10 section (2) point b aims to increase access to information and services through:

- a. counseling;
- b. facilitation of referral services; and
- c. facilitation of the receipt of social assistance programs.

(3) Mentoring of all prospective couples/prospective fertile couples as referred to in Article 10 section (2) point c must be provided 3 (three) months before marriage as part of marriage services.

(4) Surveillance of families at risk of Stunting as referred to in Article 10 section (2) point d is used as a consideration for taking necessary action in Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

(5) Stunting Case Audit as referred to in Article 10 section (2) point e aims to find the causes of Stunting cases as an effort to prevent similar cases from occurring.

(6) Stunting Deliberation as referred to in Article 10 section (2) point f is a deliberation involving related parties in the acceleration of stunting reduction at the regional, sub-district, and village levels, which aims to discuss leadership commitment, stunting cases, and issues of planning and budgeting.

(7) Mini Stunting Workshop as referred to in Article 10 section (2) point g aims to implement accelerated stunting reduction through the active role of cross-sectoral coordination and cooperation in convergence efforts.

(8) The Coordination Meeting on Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in Article 10 section (2) point h aims to coordinate, synergize, and evaluate the Administration of Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

## CHAPTER V

### ADMINISTRATION OF ACCELERATED STUNTING REDUCTION

#### Article 12

(1) The Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in Article 8 and the regional action plan as referred to in Article 9 are references for the Regional Government, Village Government, and Stakeholders in administering Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

(2) In administering Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (1), the Regional Government and Village Government implement programs and activities for Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

(3) In the implementation of programs and activities for Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (2), the Regional Government and Village Government carry out:

- a. strengthening planning and budgeting;
- b. improving the quality of implementation;
- c. improving the quality of monitoring, evaluation, and reporting; and
- d. increasing human resource capacity.

#### Article 13

(1) The Village Government organizes and implements Accelerated Stunting Reduction at the Village level.

(2) The Village Government prioritizes the use of village funds in supporting the administration of Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

(3) The Village Government optimizes village development programs and activities in supporting the administration of Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

#### Article 14

(1) In administering Accelerated Stunting Reduction, the Regional Government and Village Government may involve Stakeholders.

(2) The involvement as referred to in section (1) is carried out convergently and integratively.

#### Article 15

(1) The Regional Apparatus that administers government affairs in the field of regional development planning determines the priority village/urban village locations for the implementation of programs and activities for Accelerated Stunting Reduction after coordination with the relevant Regional Apparatus.

(2) The priority locations as referred to in section (1) are determined by considering the criteria:

- a. percentage of the population aged 15 (fifteen) to 24 (twenty-four) years;
- b. number of stunted children under 5 (five) years of age;
- c. prevalence of stunted children under 5 (five) years of age; and
- d. poverty rate.

## CHAPTER VI

### COORDINATION OF ACCELERATED STUNTING REDUCTION ADMINISTRATION

#### Part One

#### Coordination of Administration at the Regional Level

#### Article 16

(1) In administering Accelerated Stunting Reduction at the Regional level, the Regent establishes a Regional-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction team.

(2) The Regional-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction team is responsible for:

- a. coordinating, synchronizing, and ensuring the implementation of policies, programs, and activities for accelerated stunting reduction among Regional Apparatus and Village Governments, and with other stakeholders at the Regional level;
- b. ensuring the implementation of institutional capacity building and human resources at the Regional level down to the Village/Urban Village level, which is needed for accelerated stunting reduction;
- c. conducting cooperation and partnerships with stakeholders in administering accelerated stunting

reduction at the Regional level;

d. formulating and facilitating the implementation of mentoring management for accelerated stunting reduction;

e. coordinating the monitoring and evaluation of the administration of accelerated stunting reduction at the Regional level;

f. forming an Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team at the Sub-district level; and

g. reporting the administration of accelerated stunting reduction to the Steering Committee once a month or at any time if needed.

(3) The Regional-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction team as referred to in section (2) consists of Regional Apparatus and Stakeholders, including the Family Welfare Empowerment Movement Team, coordinated by BAPPEDA.

(4) The membership structure of the Regency-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction team is adjusted to the needs of the Regional Government.

## Part Two

### Coordination of Administration at the Sub-district Level

#### Article 17

(1) In administering Accelerated Stunting Reduction at the Sub-district level, the Sub-district Head establishes a Sub-district-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team and reports to the Regional-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team.

(2) The Sub-district-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team is responsible for:

a. coordinating and operationalizing the administration of accelerated stunting reduction in bringing closer the services of coordination and convergence of regency-level accelerated stunting reduction to villages/urban villages;

b. providing mentoring and supervision of the planning and utilization of village funds and village fund allocations for accelerated stunting reduction;

c. conducting cooperation and partnerships with stakeholders in administering accelerated stunting

reduction at the Sub-district level;

d. providing data on the administration of accelerated stunting reduction at the sub-district level;

e. mobilizing and providing field mentoring for accelerated stunting reduction at the sub-district level;

f. monitoring and evaluation of Stunting at the sub-district level; and

g. reporting the administration of accelerated stunting reduction to the Head of the Regency Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team 4 (four) times in 1 (one) year or at any time if needed.

(3) The Sub-district-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team as referred to in section (2) involves the Danramil, Kapolsek, Sub-district Head, Head of the Community Health Center, Family Planning Extension Workers, and Stakeholders, including the Family Welfare Empowerment Movement Team.

(4) The membership structure of the Sub-district-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team is adjusted to the needs of the Sub-district Government.

### Part Three

#### Coordination of Administration at the Village/Family Level

#### Article 18

(1) In administering Accelerated Stunting Reduction at the Village/Urban Village level, the Village Head/Urban Village Head establishes a Village/Urban Village-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction team and reports to the Sub-district-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team.

(2) The Village/Urban Village-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team is responsible for:

a. coordinating, synergizing, and evaluating the administration of Accelerated Stunting Reduction at the Village/Urban Village level;

b. coordinating the planning and budgeting of village development programs and activities to support stunting reduction;

c. ensuring that each priority target receives and utilizes priority nutrition intervention service packages, implementation of activities is carried out in cooperation with the family mentoring team, human development cadres, Family Hope Program mentors; Community Health Center officers and

village midwives, and Family Planning Extension Workers; and

d. strengthening the monitoring and evaluation of service delivery to all priority targets and coordinating the recording of targets and routine data updates.

(3) The Village/Family-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team involves:

a. Health workers, at least including midwives, nutritionists, and environmental health workers;

b. Family Planning Extension Workers and/or Family Planning Field Officers;

c. Family Welfare Empowerment Movement Team; and

d. Village Family Planning Supervisors and/or Sub-Village Family Planning Supervisors/Human Development Cadres, Cadres, and/or other community elements.

(4) The membership structure of the Village/Urban Village-level Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team is adjusted to the needs of the Village/Urban Village Government.

## CHAPTER VII

### MONITORING, EVALUATION, AND REPORTING

#### Article 19

Monitoring, evaluation, and reporting aim to:

a. determine the progress and success of the implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction;

b. provide feedback for the progress of the implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction;

c. be a consideration for planning and budgeting and improving the accountability of Accelerated Stunting Reduction;

d. provide an assessment of the conformity to the activities, outputs, and targets of the Strategy for Accelerated Stunting Reduction and the Regional action plan; and

e. be a consideration for providing recommendations for achieving the success of the implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction.

#### Article 20

(1) Monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction are carried out by the Regional Government, Sub-district, and Village/Urban Village Government according to their authority.

(2) The Head of Implementation coordinates the monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction in the Regional Government, Sub-district, and Village Government as referred to in section (1).

(3) Monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (1) are supported by:

- a. an integrated data management system in the Region, Sub-district, and Village/Urban Village by maximizing existing information systems through the integrated data mechanism owned in accordance with the provisions of Laws and Regulations; and
- b. research and innovation and the development of the utilization of research and innovation results.

## Article 21

The Village Head/Urban Village Head, through the Sub-district Head, submits a report on the administration of Accelerated Stunting Reduction to the Regent through the Coordinator of the Accelerated Stunting Reduction Team, at least once every 3 (three) months or at any time if needed.

## Article 22

Further provisions regarding guidelines for Monitoring, Evaluation, and reporting on the implementation of Accelerated Stunting Reduction are regulated in the Regional Action Plan.

## CHAPTER VIII

### ROLE OF COMMUNITY INSTITUTIONS AND BUSINESSES

## Article 23

(1) Efforts for integrated Accelerated Stunting Reduction can be facilitated through Village Community Institutions, community organizations, religious organizations, businesses, universities, professional organizations, community organizations, religious organizations, non-governmental organizations, philanthropic institutions, mass media, business actors, and community members in the Regency of Gresik.

(2) Efforts for integrated Accelerated Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (1) can be carried out by developing innovative activities.

## CHAPTER IX

### FUNDING

## Article 24

Sources of funding for Accelerated Stunting Reduction come from:

- a. the Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget;
- b. the Village Revenue and Expenditure Budget; and/or
- c. other legitimate sources in accordance with the provisions of Laws and Regulations.

## CHAPTER X

### FINAL PROVISIONS

## Article 25

This Regional Regulation takes effect on the date of its enactment.

In order for everyone to know, this Regional Regulation is ordered to be enacted by placing it in the
